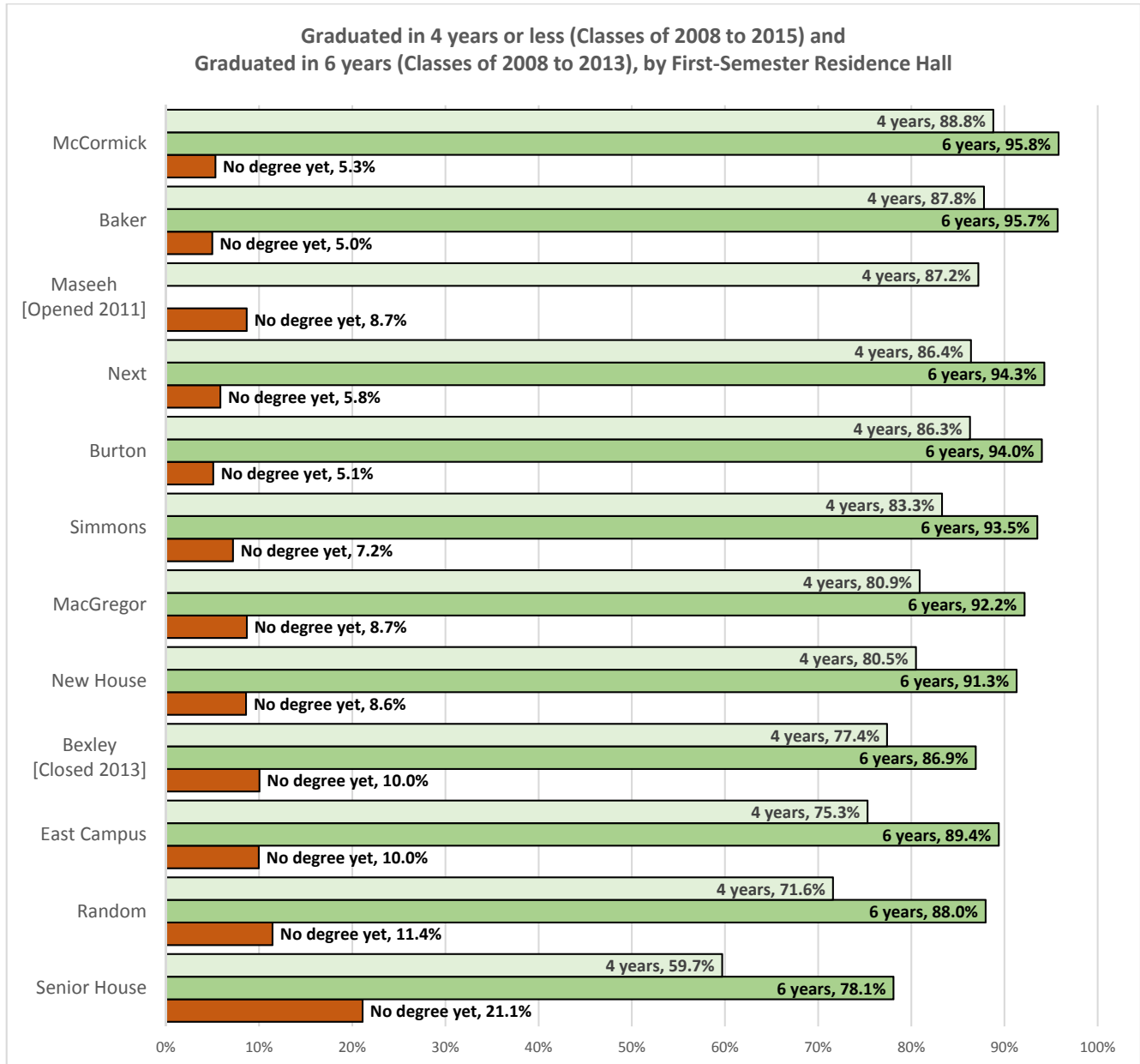


## MIT Undergraduate Graduation Rates

For all students admitted to the Classes of 2008 to 2015, we have data for when they were awarded a Bachelor of Science (SB) degree, and which residence hall they lived in during their first semester at MIT. With that data, we calculated three rates, the percentage of first-semester residents in a residence hall who:

1. Were awarded an SB degree in 4 years or less;
2. Were awarded an SB degree in 6 years or less;  
*This includes students who may have enrolled in a program that grants an undergraduate an SB and a Master's in 5 years, and students who take additional time to pursue multiple SB degrees or majors.*
3. Have not yet been awarded an SB.

### Graduation Rates by First-Semester Residence Hall\*



\* The Classes of 2014 and 2015 are not included in the 6-year graduation rate because they had not had a 5<sup>th</sup> or 6<sup>th</sup> year to graduate when this analysis was completed. Students in the Classes of 2008 to 2015 who were not awarded a degree by January 2016 were labeled "No degree yet." Chart is sorted in order of 4-year graduation rate, descending. With rare exceptions, all first-year students must live in one of MIT's 11 residence halls, so fraternities, sororities and independent living groups are not included in this analysis.
